#### Hardware Needed:

### Lamp Starter Kit (PN: DKIT-03SP):

Includes 2 Lamp Modules and an Input Output Module



# Dimmer Starter Kit (PN: DKIT-04SP):

Includes 2 Dimmer modules and 1 I/O module



#### How it works:

Because there is no direct integration with Honeywell security panels and Simply-Automated lighting products, a 4204/4101sn relay module/s and/or a Positive or Negative voltage trigger is required to activate the three Inputs on the Input/Output Module.

<sup>\*\* -</sup> Each Panel Support Different Trigger Functions, Refer to the panels Installation instructions for more details.

#### Pre-Configured Input 1:

- Low voltage input (Only).
- Turns on one lamp module from DKIT-03SP (or one dimmer from DKIT-04SP) when trigger is enabled.
- Turns off one lamp module from DKIT-03SP (or one dimmer from DKIT-04SP) when trigger is disabled.

Used for delay entry/exit (lights on for entry, off for exit), arm/disarm acknowledgement, door strike or motion sensor interface. Installer needs to program security panel for each trigger interface. (Provide 0 Volt 'off' or 4 Volt AC/DC min to 40 Volt AC/DC Maximum 'on' trigger) from security panel connect to input terminals 6/7 of the I/O Module.

### Pre-Configured Input 2:


- Low voltage or contact closure input.
- Turns on both lights and flashes when triggered is enabled.
- Turns off lights and stops flashing dimmers when trigger is disabled. Used for fire, intrusion or panic alarms.
- Installer needs to program security panel for alarm type and trigger.
- Low voltage wires (Provide 0 Volt 'off' or 4 Volt AC/DC min to 40 Volt AC/DC Maximum 'on' trigger) from security panel connect to input terminals 8/9, or contact closure wires (provide open 'off' or closed 'on' trigger) connect to input terminals 9/10 of the I/O module.

#### Pre-Configured Input 3:


- Low voltage or contact closure input.
- Turns on both lights when trigger is enabled.
- Turns off both lights when trigger is disabled.

Used for fire, intrusion or panic alarms. Installer needs to program security panel for alarm type and trigger. Low voltage wires (provide 0 Volt 'off' or 4 Volt AC/DC min to 40 Volt AC/DC Maximum 'on' trigger) from security panel connect to input terminals 14/15, or contact closure wires (provide open – 'off' or closed – 'on' trigger) connect to input terminals 15/16 of the I/O Module.

### Programming:

Each Input on the I/O module can be program based on the any event that is set up in your Relay Programming section of your security panel. Each Input will supply a different output. Refer to the Pre-Configured Inputs Section above when considering your lighting application.

#### Example:

I want to flash both lights on any burglar alarm.

- You will program the panel to activate on a Start Zone Type of 33 Any Burglar Alarm
- Stop on Disarm Zone Type 22.
- The next step is to assign it to a relay or voltage trigger.
- After the programming is done test to confirm that the relay module and/or voltage trigger has toggled.
- Wire the relay or voltage trigger to input #2 since it is predefined to flash both lights when activated.

When using Honeywell security panels to activate the Simply-Automated Input/Output module there are a couple things to take into consideration:

- 1. Activating the input does not directly control a light; refer to the Pre-Configured Inputs Section above.
- 2. Each panel is limited to the # of Out Puts it has available; refer to page 1 for compatible panels and supported outputs.
